

MY BALETTAN

Relationships are beautiful, but it becomes more painful when we miss the other person forever. In my case, it's about my grandpa, whom I fondly called 'Balettan', and me. He stayed in our hometown and we visited him a few times a year. But whenever I was with him, I spent a lot of time chatting with him on many topics like sports, the air force etc. Maybe for hours, and yet I was never bored. He was an Air Force officer, had won many medals, and had gone on missions abroad.

During the spike of covid - 19 cases in mid-2021, many lost their loved ones. One day, my grandfather felt sick and my uncle, my dad's younger brother, came from Trivandrum and immediately took him to the hospital. We were worried and planned our journey. It was the 2nd outbreak of covid, the dreaded delta. We had to wait 2 – 3 days for the RT-PCR result, get the pass, and cross the border.

My uncle was all alone with my grandpa in the hospital and struggled a lot all those days. It took a few more days for us to get going. There were no shops on the way, and without eating anything, we went straight to Kerala. After driving 12 hours, my dad rushed straight to the hospital leaving us in our grandparent's home. Soon, Grandpa got admitted to the ICU as his oxygen level started dropping rapidly. Everybody was scared, worried, shocked, and in despair, but still hopeful. We all clung to that ray of hope. My dad and my uncle were the ones who suffered a lot. As the scare of covid rose, protections came up too. They had to wear an N-95 mask 24/7 and could only remove their masks only when they were alone in a dormitory. Even in our house, everybody started wearing masks. One day my Grandpa was on a video call. I can't describe how I felt when I saw him on the call. He had an oxygen mask on and multiple tubes surrounding him. My grandma rushed to her room and started to cry.



We all felt sad in our hearts but no one dared to show it outside. We told him he would be fine and be back home in a jiffy. But regardless of his condition, he asked whether we bought prawns for me, and that's how much my grandpa cared for me. My grandpa, being a vegetarian always made sure that I had my favourite sea food there whenever I visited them. I smiled and still had a ray of hope shining in my heart. The next day at around 10: 30 PM, my grandpa was admitted to the ventilator. He needed life support and my Grandma was crying when my dad spoke with her. I told my cousins and sister and we both started crying too. The next day early morning my mom woke me up from sleep and told me that my Grandpa was with god. I couldn't brush my teeth properly as I tried to let the sad news sink in.

People came to mourn at our hours and my cousin sister and I had to eat biscuits for our breakfast but I felt like throwing up. Then an ambulance reached our gate and I saw that somebody carrying my grandpa wrapped in white cloth with two nose muffs.

The first death anniversary of my Grandpa was a couple of weeks back and we did the rituals for him. I miss my grandpa more during the IPL matches as I used to call him on the phone to discuss CSK's game. I felt I could have spent more time with him on every vacation when I thought about it .He was calm and humble always, and whenever got to see him one last time before his passing in real. We often take

relationship for granted and realise the value once they leave us forever. Instead, we should celebrate every moment of our relationships.
