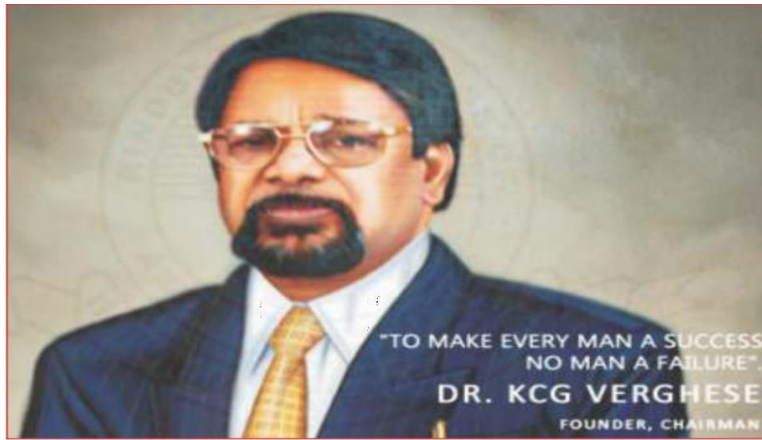

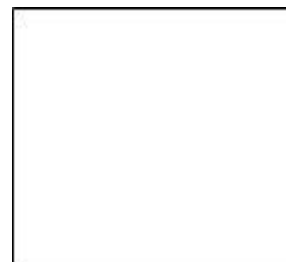

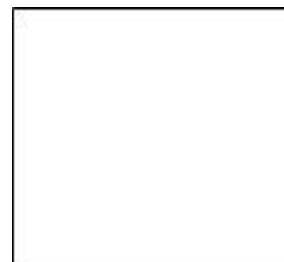

RULES AND REGULATIONS

SCHOOL DIARY

1. Every pupil must possess a copy of the School Diary which should be brought to the School every day. Apart from entering the name and other personal data, pupils should not enter any information not related to school work.
2. Pupils must show the diary to their Parents whenever they are given notes by the Principal or Teacher and obtain the Parents signature. Entries made by the Parents/Guardians should also be shown to the Principal/Coordinator/Class Teacher/Subject Teacher.
3. Parents are requested to look into their Children's School Diary every day for any updates from school.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

1. The application for leave should be entered on the pages specified in the School Calendar and submitted for Class Teacher's initials on the next reporting day.
2. For every absence, a written statement signed by the Parent/Guardian is required on the day the pupil returns. **If the student is absent for more than 15 days continuously for reasons of ill-health, a certificate from a doctor is required stating illness and fitness.**
3. **Students will not be allowed to leave the School early to attend functions or some other practice session.** In case, for genuine reason, the student has to leave early the parents must fill the prescribed performa available in the school office and send a mail request well in advance to the Class Teacher/Coordinator/School office.
4. Attendance on the first day of school after vacation and reporting to School on time is mandatory.
5. Any unscheduled holidays will be made good by the school according to the days available.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

1. Pupils are requested to behave politely and avoid use of indecent language or actions injurious to the feelings of fellow students, teachers, or others in the School. Any such behaviour indicative of hurting others, caste or community will attract serious disciplinary action.
2. Serious violation of the rules and regulations and the discipline of the school is punishable including removal or expulsion from the school. Such actions will normally follow a written warning to allow improvement in conduct.
3. Pupils who are selected to participate in various co-curricular activities during class hours need to obtain a written permission from the Class Teacher / Coordinator / Principal.

4. Staying away from school events without prior permission and/or justification will be considered as a breach of school discipline.
5. No Student is allowed to use the **Smart Boards/ Laptops/ Overhead Projector** without the permission of the teacher.
6. Students must be punctual for class every working day. They must be present in the school by __ am. Proper decorum has to be maintained during and after the Assembly
7. All Students must be in their classrooms seated before the teacher enters the classroom. During the absence of the teacher or period change over, proper discipline has to be maintained. The Class Monitor should see to the discipline and his/her command is to be obeyed by all.

DISCIPLINE GUIDELINES WHILE TRAVELING IN SCHOOL BUS

1. No part of the student's body (arms, head etc.) should be held out of an open window at any time.
2. Objects should never be thrown in the bus or out of the window.
3. Students must never move from seat to seat while the bus is in motion. Neither are they allowed to stand and travel.
4. Students are not permitted to reserve seats for themselves or for their friends.
5. No drinking or eating is allowed while the bus is on the move.
6. The upholstery of the bus should not be damaged or marked in any way.
7. Shouting / quarrelling / fighting are not permitted in the School bus.
8. Students in the bus should obey the "Instructions & Guidance of the Bus Driver" or escorting staff.

SCHOOL PROPERTY

1. Every student should take care of School Property. Intended or neglectful damage to School Property is a serious breach of School discipline and will have to be made good by the defaulting Students.
2. Students should co-operate with the Library, Computer, and Laboratory staff in maintaining order and discipline. Students shall take care not to lose, damage, or deface any of the materials, fixtures, or equipment that is provided.
3. Damages done even by accident should be reported at once to the Class Teacher/Principal. Any damage done will be made good by the one who has done it.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS:

1. Pupils should not bring valuables or money to school. They are not allowed to bring to School: **magazines, mobile phones, video games, cameras, pictures or books, CD/pen drives/cassettes** other than prescribed, except when asked by the Teacher.
2. Students found possessing any reading, viewing or any other material of unaccepted nature are liable for rustication without notice.
3. Every pupil should take care of his/her personal belongings. The school authorities do not assume responsibility for loss of such belongings.
4. The name of the student and class should be marked on the personal belongings to facilitate recovery when lost in the School premises.

CLEANLINESS :

1. Pupils must come to school in neat, clean proper school uniforms and shoes as per the time table. Nails and hair to be properly trimmed regularly.
2. It is the duty of all the students to keep their classrooms and other places in and around the school clean and in order. They should dispose of garbage only in the dust bins provided.
3. Before leaving the classroom, students will pick up waste paper, any unwanted material from the floor and place it in the dust bin. They will leave desks and chairs in proper order and will switch off all lights , fans and electrical equipment.

LIBRARY :

1. Strict silence should be observed in the library at all times.
2. Students must acquire the habit of reading as it is important for their education process. Parents are required to motivate their children to cultivate this habit.
3. Books will be issued to all students.
4. Any book that is lost must be replaced or duly compensated for. A fine will be levied for damage to books borrowed.
5. No book, magazine, or newspaper should be taken out of the library without the permission of the Librarian/ Teacher in charge.

OBJECTIONABLE MATERIALS :

1. Students are strictly forbidden to bring any offensive literature.
2. Children are forbidden from bringing crackers, explosives and other dangerous materials to School.

3. No student should bring any electronic gadgets or pen drive as they are not permitted on the school campus.

MALPRACTICES :

1. Any Student found copying or indulging in any type of malpractice during the tests/assessments will not be allowed to take subsequent assessments until the Principal grants him/her written permission besides giving zero in the subject concerned along with a warning letter.
2. Such student must bring his/her Parents to meet the Principal. Repetition of the same will result in dismissal/expulsion from School.
3. A student who tampers with the marks, answer sheets or school certificates will be suspended.

PARTICIPATION IN SPORTS AND GAMES :

1. Every student must take part in School Games and other activities unless declared physically unfit or exempted by the Principal on any grounds like medical treatment, illness, chronic ailment etc.
2. Attendance in all official School functions like Exhibition, Sports Day, National Days, Annual Day, etc. is mandatory.
3. Absentees may be fined or penalized.

CONCERNING DEFAULTERS, ACCIDENTS & EXCURSION:

1. The school accepts no responsibility if the student is made to return home during class hours for not wearing the correct and proper school uniform, for not bringing the books to class, for not producing the signature of parents on remarks written by Teachers or on Absence Record in the Calendar for reasons of indiscipline and for repeated late comings.
2. The School cannot be held responsible for accidents, small or serious to Students during School hours or excursions.
3. Students are not allowed to meet Parents or to leave the School premises during School hours without the permission of the Principal.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES :

1. In case of any medical emergency arising during School hours for any child, the School will provide the needed first aid within the campus and the In-House Nurse will inform the Parents about the same. Further steps will be taken only after seeking the necessary consent from the Parents.
2. If your child is provided any regular medicine during School hours, we request

you to kindly inform the School nurse and the class teacher about the same and also submit a letter and the prescription from the doctor.

PRIOR PERMISSION:

1. No money or articles of presentation shall be collected by anybody without the permission of the Principal.
2. Any organized activity in the School can be conducted only after getting the prior permission of the Management through the Principal.

PARENT- TEACHER INTERACTION :

1. The co-operation and goodwill of the Parents is an essential component of an effective Parent-Teacher relationship in order to provide maximum educational opportunities for children. The School needs the involvement of Parents in many of its activities.
2. Parents are encouraged to bring positive suggestions for the improvement of academic standards.
3. Parents shall not attempt to meet the Teachers when a class is in progress.
4. Criticism of Teachers in the presence of the Students is best avoided. Legitimate complaints should be brought to the notice of the Principal without delay through mail or one to one meeting.
5. Parents have the responsibility to encourage modest, decent, and good dressing habits conforming to acceptable social etiquettes in children from early stages to their development.
6. Attending the PTA meeting as well as other important functions in the School is the duty and service Parents owe to their children.
7. Parents shall check the Class Log every day in ERP to take note of communication from the School and also for homework given (can also be viewed on the School Web Services).
8. Any requests, complaints, etc., should be given in writing at the School Office or online addressed with a copy to the Principal.
9. Parents are requested to kindly verify with the Teachers about the timings of special classes.
10. Parents who are willing to volunteer for any School activities are requested to register their names with their areas of interest and available time frame.

UNIFORMS- PATTERN AND POLICY

1. Boys uniform:

- (a) Ivory shirt
- (b) Green Checked Shorts
- (c) Green Trousers and School Tie from Grade IV onwards.

2. Girls Uniform:

- (a) Ivory Blouse
- (b) Green checked Skirt
- (c) Green Trousers and School Tie from Grade IV onwards.

3. Sports Uniform:

Track Suits with T-shirts of Respective House Colour.

On Special/Celebration/Colour Days:

1. Students are free to wear shorts, trousers or skirts of their choice but these should be respectable, i.e. Jeans should have no holes or frayed edges.
2. Foot wear should be appropriate, e.g. no high heels, strap sandals to be worn.
3. Children should not move barefoot around the School Ground.
4. Hair to be maintained neat and tidy at all times.
5. Hair styles should not be attention seeking, extreme, or a safety hazard. With the exception of religious or medical reasons, shaved heads are not allowed. Long hair should be tied back neatly plaited or when the Teacher requests for health and safety reasons.
6. Students who do not arrive in School in proper uniform will attract disciplinary action/sent home.
7. Hats will not be worn in the building, except for academic or extra-curricular activities with the permission of the Staff.
8. Only small stud earrings are permitted for students. Avoid long hanging earrings. No rings or gold accessories allowed for any child.
9. Students should not display inappropriate symbols or messages on items of clothing or accessories.
10. The School Administration reserves the right to determine whether a student's attire is within the limits of decency or modesty. A Student failing to conform to these dress code standards may be withdrawn from lessons or sent home.

Note:

On Birthdays, students can bring only chocolates/sweets /pens/pencils (any one) to share with friends. Cakes and expensive gifts are strictly not allowed in the school with or without permission from any authority.

TRANSFER CERTIFICATE REGULATIONS :

1. Application for Transfer Certificates should be submitted to the Principal by 31 January of the school year failing which, the First Instalment Fees for the new session should be remitted.
2. If the student is withdrawn in the middle of the year, the fee has to be paid for the full year inclusive of the transport fee and **student is not eligible for refund of caution deposit too.**
3. Transfer Certificate should be requested in prescribed proforma available in School office and Web portal with the required documents. No transfer certificate will be issued during vacations.
4. Transfer Certificate will be given only to those who have settled all the school dues and the No dues form acknowledged by the concerned authorities.
5. Caution Deposit will be refunded once the TC formalities are completed and only for those applied TC within the month of January and Otherwise not eligible for refund of Caution deposit.
6. Transfer Certificate once issued cannot be cancelled. **Re-admission will be as per the admission procedure and considered only as new admission.**

FEE DETAILS :

1. All the payments are required to be paid either by Demand Draft or by Bank Transfer or by Credit / Debit Card at the School Counters.

2. Fee if paid online, parents should mail the online Fee remittance receipt to the Class Teacher/school accountant for the confirmation of the payment along with the details of the student.

3. The Tuition Fees and Transport Fees are required to be paid in 3 (three) installments though we have two academic terms only as per CBSE guidelines and all other fees are required to be paid at the time of Joining / before commencement of the Academic Year.
